



key topics - proposed changes for GO

- ✓ Voluntary → mandatory for all RES claims
- √ Harmonization
- ✓ Electricity only → gas, heating/cooling
- ✓ NOT full disclosure (=track all power)
- ✓ «Mandatory auctioning»
 - GOs from supported power plants
 - Severes GO link with PPA project
